

## YEARS 7-12 GIRLS UNIFORM

The College uniform is a vital representation of the school and its ethos, value base and placement as a private school. Therefore, the College enforces the adherence of the uniform policy by requiring students to be correct uniform before attending classes. The school appreciates support from parents in directing their students to wear the uniform as required.

All uniform items are available from the College Uniform Shop.

### Uniform Guidelines:

**Skirts:** Must be touching the knee when standing straight. Skirts may be worn longer if desired but not shorter. 'Blind hems' are to be used when hemming skirts and a generous hem allowance is to be maintained to ensure a professional finish. All raw edges need to be overlocked. Skirts are not to be 'rolled.'

**Tie:** Years 7-10 - Regulation Navy button-on crossover tie.  
Year 11 & 12 - Regulation 'Men's' style Navy button on tie.

**Jumper:** The College Jumper can be worn with the formal dress uniform and the sport uniform. The College Sports Jacket cannot be worn with the formal uniform during Terms 1 and 4. During Terms 2 & 3, the College Sports Jacket may be worn over the formal jumper during cold weather only.

**Socks:** College logoed white ankle socks. Plain navy opaque tights or stockings may be worn during Terms 2 & 3. White socks are not to be worn over the top of tights.

**Hair:** Hair accessories are to be navy, black or white and unadorned with lace, flowers, bows etc.

Hair must be kept away from the face. Hair that is below the shoulder in length must be tied up. Hair colour is to be natural in appearance and close to natural colour. Students may be excluded from school until their hair meets the hair policy requirements. A final decision on hair will always be at the discretion of the College Administration.

**Sport:** College navy shorts, navy polo shirt and white ankle socks with the TVAC logo. The TVAC jumper and/or sport jacket with College logo. College issue track pants can be worn only on sports days during Terms 2 & 3. Shorts and track pants are not to be 'rolled.'

**Hat:** Students are expected to wear their TVAC hat during breaks, sport, PDHPE and Agriculture classes during Term 1 & 4 and are to have a hat available to wear during Terms 2 & 3 when asked to by a teacher.

**Formal Shoes:** Only black, leather or synthetic 'leather look' polished 'Clarke' style school shoes are to be worn with the formal dress uniform. No pattern or embellished stitching is allowed. Shoes should offer appropriate heel and arch support with heels no higher than 3 cm. The toes should be completely enclosed.

**NOT ALLOWED:** Slipper, ballerina or flat-soled shoes, skate/street shoes, Volleys, canvas shoes, hiking shoes or black leather Lynx style runners.

**Sport Shoes:** Sport Shoes must be lace up runners / sneakers / joggers / cross trainers.

**Colour:** Students may wear any appropriate sport shoe that will provide support and protection for their feet. This does not include skate shoes, street shoes, volleys or canvas converse shoes as they do not provide the support required for physical activity. Basketball style shoes that extend above the ankle bone are not allowed.

A final decision on sport shoes will always be at the discretion of the College Administration.

**Jewellery:** Gold or silver plain stud earrings only (Size 3-4mm). One stud per earlobe is permitted. Any new piercings are to be done over the Christmas break to ensure jewellery guidelines can be met before returning to school. Retainers are not to be used with the uniform except for one clear plastic micro retainer in the nose. Any other jewellery worn will be confiscated until the end of the term.

**Undergarments:** Girl's undergarments are to be natural in colour (i.e. no black or bright colours) when worn under the white formal blouse. T-shirts and singlets worn under the uniform must not extend beyond the blouse, must be white and not have emblems or slogans etc visible under or through the uniform. Singlets are to be tucked in and not visible below the bottom of shirts.

**Non-uniform dress days:** Students are to dress modestly on free dress days. For girls, no singlets or tank tops are allowed, and shorts must come to the bottom of their fingers when standing straight with arms by their side. Low cut tops are not to be worn. The jewellery policy still applies to free dress days. For safety reasons, students must wear covered in shoes. A free-dress hat must be worn in all outdoor activities, PE, recess and lunch.

## YEARS 7-12 BOYS UNIFORM

The College uniform is a vital representation of the school and its ethos, value base and placement as a private school. Therefore, the College enforces the adherence of the uniform policy by requiring students to be correct uniform before attending classes. The school appreciates support from parents in directing their students to wear the uniform as required.

All uniform items are available from the College Uniform Shop.

Shorts: midnight navy flexi-waist.

Shirt: White short-sleeve shirts.

Socks: Knee-high turnover socks.

Tie: Terms 2 & 3.

- Year 11 & 12 - Navy Senior tie.
- Year 7-10 - Navy Junior tie.

Jumper: The College Jumper can be worn with the formal dress uniform and the sport uniform. The College Sports Jacket cannot be worn with the formal uniform during Terms 1 and 4. During Terms 2 & 3, the College Sports Jacket may be worn over the formal jumper during cold weather only.

Hair: Hair must be tidy and clear of the collar, ears and eyebrows. Students' haircuts must trend toward a conservative style. Hair should not be shorter than a No 2 blade clipper. Hair may be tied back in a bun that is positioned low at the back of the head, or product sensibly used if this helps the student comply with the code. Hair colour should look natural and be close to natural colour. Boys must be cleanshaven. Students may be excluded from school until their hair meets the hair policy requirements. A final decision on hair will always be at the discretion of the College Administration.

Sport: College navy shorts, navy polo shirt and white ankle socks with the TVAC logo. The TVAC jumper and/or sport jacket with College logo. College issue track pants can be worn only on sports days during Terms 2 & 3.

Hat: Students are expected to wear their TVAC hat during breaks, sport, PDHPE and Agriculture classes during Term 1 & 4 and are to have a hat available to wear during Terms 2 & 3 when asked to by a teacher.

Formal Shoes: Black, leather or synthetic 'leather look' polished 'Clarke' style school shoes only are to be worn with the formal dress uniform. No pattern or embellished stitching is allowed. Shoes should offer appropriate heel and arch support. The toes should be completely enclosed. Flat-soled shoes, skate/street shoes, Volleys, canvas shoes, hiking shoes or black leather Lynx style runners will not be allowed.

Sport Shoes: Sport Shoes must be lace up runners / sneakers / joggers / cross trainers.

Colour: Students may wear any appropriate sport shoe that will provide support and protection for their feet. This does not include skate shoes, street shoes, volleys or canvas converse shoes as they do not provide the support required for physical activity. Basketball style shoes that extend above the ankle bone are not allowed.

A final decision on sport shoes will always be at the discretion of the College Administration.

Jewellery: No jewellery is to be worn. Any jewellery worn will be confiscated until the end of the term. Any piercing is to be done over the Christmas break in order to allow a minimum 6 weeks before returning to school. Retainers are not to be used with the uniform except for one clear plastic micro retainer in the nose.

Undergarments: T-shirts and singlets worn under the uniform must be white and not have emblems or slogans etc visible under or through the uniform. Singlets are to be tucked in and not visible below the bottom of shirts/sleeves.

Non-Uniform Day Guidelines: Students are to dress modestly on all camps, excursions and free dress days. The jewellery policy still applies to free dress days. For safety reasons, students must wear covered in shoes. A free-dress hat must be worn in all outdoor activities — PE, recess and lunch.
