

Representative Sport Guidelines

B9 – Discipline

Tweed Valley Adventist College values opportunities for students to represent the College with pride across a wide range of sports. Participation in representative sport involves significant planning, organisation, supervision, risk management, and financial commitment to ensure events operate safely, equitably, and in alignment with college expectations.

This guideline outlines the procedures and expectations that apply to all representative sporting events.

1. Registration Process

Invitations to compete in representative sport will be communicated via Consent2Go.

If registration is not completed by the stated cut-off date, the student will be deemed unavailable and will not be entered in the event. Late registrations cannot be accepted due to external booking, transport, supervision, and competition deadlines outside the College's control.

2. Representative Fees

Representative fees must be finalised by the published payment deadline prior to the event.

If a parent/carer elects to transport their own child to and from the event, the full representative levy may still apply. This ensures shared fixed costs (including team entry, venue, and supervision costs) are distributed equitably across all participants.

3. Outstanding Accounts

Students with outstanding representative sport fees from previous events may be ineligible to represent the College until accounts are brought up to date or a formal payment arrangement is in place.

Families experiencing financial difficulty are encouraged to contact the College Administration Office prior to the payment deadline to discuss possible support or structured payment arrangements.

4. Our Commitment & Community Support

The College is committed to providing high-quality sporting opportunities that:

- Develop skill, teamwork, and resilience
- Encourage positive school spirit and community pride
- Promote leadership, integrity, and exemplary sportsmanship
- Uphold the College's values and behavioural expectations

The college asks families to support this by:

- Monitoring Consent2Go communications

- Responding to invitations as soon as possible
- Ensuring payments are finalised by the required date

Prompt responses from families enables the College to continue offering safe, well-organised, and valuable sporting experiences for our students.
